Handwriting

Today, we will practise the next three capital letters. Read the rhyme below each letter to help you form it correctly. Try one line of each in your handwriting copy. If you need to, use our stretch poems between each line.

** I stretch my hands, I squeeze my hands....

** five little peas in a peapod pressed....

** Open, shut them, open, shut them, give a little clap!.....



Draw a straight line like a fireman's pole. Join the top to the bottom with a big loop, that's your goal.



Make a straight line going down first, then three lines more. Stretching to the right to make the sky, the middle and the floor. The middle line is shorter than the other two lines. You've made a capital E and you're doing just fine!



A bit like a capital E, but with three lines not four. There isn't a line along the floor. There's a flat line at the top from the left to the right. And a shorter one underneath, that looks just right.
